Our church bells have been well received! We have heard from many that this has brought great comfort to you all. As a reminder, our church bells are now ringing at 9am, 12pm, 3pm, and 6pm. Our song selection changes weekly. If there is a particular song you would like to hear, you can call our rectory at 402-435-2125 with your request or you can email your request to stmarylincoln@windstream.net. We may or not have your request in our music library, but we will do our best.

We will now be able to accept electronic giving through our Diocesan Online Giving site. The online giving site can be reached by going to the Diocesan website's "Donate" page, or <https://lincolndiocese.aware3.net/give/>.

Food Net will continue on Saturdays at 1pm. The format will be different, as to allow the state guideline of 10 people or less at a time.

We are now live-streaming Sunday **Mass** from St. Mary's on Saturdays at 4:00 pm. You can find the livestream on our Facebook page, our webpage, or by going to Youtube directly and searching for Fr. Dietrich's Youtube channel.

Confessions are being heard at their usual times, but instead of in the church, they are being heard outside the pastor's office window. Look for signs and directions between the church and rectory.

Communion calls to the sick have been curtailed until further notice unless there is a genuine danger of death, in which case the priest should still be informed immediately.

Mass Intentions: We will still be scheduling Masses as we normally do (in the hope that the Coronavirus threat is resolved sooner rather than later). These Mass intentions are being said by the priests in private Masses; some will have to be rescheduled.

Church Support: The church may be empty, but our expenses go on. We are exploring different possibilities for on-line giving in the future; right now, for those whose income has NOT been disrupted by the Coronavirus, we ask you to consider sending in your support through the regular mail.

Adoration: Parishioners are still allowed, and in fact encouraged, to make visits to the church to pray before our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament. The Church is being kept locked; however, we have keys made for people to check out (leave another key, car or house, with us to ensure the church key comes back). We are allowing people in the church for prayer between 10 am and 8 pm.
