Notes from the Pastor's desk...

Bishop's Appeal for Vocations. This weekend we welcome two seminarians to our parish, Caleb Hansen and Kade Palmer. They are with us to open the Bishop's Appeal for Vocations, the annual campaign we have for the support of our seminarians. The seminarians will speak briefly at the end of Mass and will be available following Mass to greet you.

I will preach the weekend Masses of September 25/26 on the appeal, share with you our parish goal, and encourage your participation. I'm also the coordinator for the Bishop's Appeal for Vocation across the diocese. A little added pressure on us to do it right at home and be an example for others across the diocese! Actually, this appeal touches us all deeply: when you look at the faces of those young men in formation, you can't help but want to support them. Young, eager, hope-filled. They are strong and courageous too. I could go on but I don't want to spoil all the thunder I hope to use in my homily next week! We'll have cards available the next two weekends. If you pay with cash or check, remember to bring them with you to Mass. We also have the capacity for credit card payment. Thank you in advance for your support.

Visioning Committee Meeting. Our next meeting for the Visioning Committee is September 28, at 7pm. We will discuss John Ferrone's recommendations for the next steps of this process and make a decision whether to hire him or find another avenue for continuing this work. Please come. Big meeting. Big decision.

Parish Mission Statement Work. Last Tuesday, about 20 of us met with John Ferrone and came up with several draft forms of a mission statement. We didn't reach consensus on the exact words, but we're close. One thing is becoming clear: we have two elements of our identity that we are very clear about, that we identify ourselves with Mary, and we want to serve as an oasis or home for the spiritual care of those who come to us in our downtown parish. The "cool" thing that is happening is how this process is changing us. We're learning to work together. We're opening our hearts to one another. We're identifying this parish as our home, our place of worship, our work. Very nice. That is what the visioning process is all about, and the gift we will offer every member of our parish as we move the process forward.

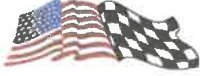

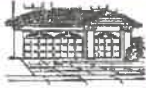
