Notes from the Pastor...

Thanksgiving Day Mass Schedule. Mass will be at 9am on Thanksgiving Day. Confessions will be available from 8am until shortly before 9am. Let us gather and give thanks to the Lord!

Open Meeting on Facility Audit. Please consider attending the meeting of the Church Restoration Committee and Clark Enersen, scheduled for Tuesday, November 30 at 7pm in the church hall. Clark Enersen will discuss the findings of their facility audit and take questions about what they found, what they propose, and the estimated cost to restore the church.

Christ the King. This weekend, the Church celebrates the Solemnity of Christ the King. Made a celebration of the Universal Church in 1925 by Pope Pius XI, this feast called the world to acknowledge the Lordship of Christ over all creation, over all time, all human activity and all human heart. Of course, acknowledging was only the beginning. This truth is to lead us all, individuals, families, communities, nations, and the human family to open our lives to Him, follow Him and work peacefully to advance His Kingdom.

The Feast calls us to individual conversion, to root our of our lives habitual sin--which is the presence of another king's rule in us (namely ourself or the Devil). It is also a call to advance the reign of Christ in the social order-in our public life. This can be done in very active ways, like running for public office, establishing policies at work that follow Christian ethical principles, supporting institutions of the Church (schools, hospitals, social service agencies, parishes) that operate in the social order and are necessary as signs and voices of Christ in the secular world. It can also be done in very simple but indirect ways like a nativity creche or a statue of Mary on the front lawn, bumper stickers that promote Divine Mercy, Keeping Christ in Christmas or Pro-Life, or avoiding commercial activity on Sunday.

This is a good time to stop, pray and consider: as we enter into the Advent and Christmas seasons ahead, how can we make these periods of time more deeply Christ-centered, and opportunities that anticipate, welcome and love the King who came and continues to live among us?

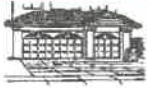
