Parish Finance Council

The Parish Finance Council will have its quarterly meeting on Tues-

day, January 18 at 7pm in the classroom beneath the rectory. We will review the financial activities of the parish for the first two quarters of our fiscal year.

Some Progress on one of the Projects.

Our restoration committee submitted a proposal in December to the District Energy Corporation (DEC) to request a study on the feasibility of St. Mary's linking into the heating and cooling systems of the DEC—the source for the capitol and other government buildings in the area. We wanted to explore this possibility since the restoration work will require a new HVAC system for the church. The DEC cannot provide the cost for this study, so our group has authorized the requested amount for the study, \$7,885. Our request for the study will go before the Board of the DEC this week, and if permission is granted, the study will commence and should be completed in about 3 months. Ever-Green Energy from St. Paul Minnesota is the company that will undertake the feasibility study.

Pro-Life Mass

The parish will host the Nebraska Catholic Conference Pro-Life Mass on Saturday, January 29 at 9am. Bishop Joseph Hanefeldt, Bishop of Grand Island will be the principal celebrant. Fr. Justin Fulton, Vicar General for the Diocese of Lincoln is the homilist. Seminarians are helping with ushering and music. Newman Center students are serving as acolytes, reader and servers. It will be a beautiful Mass. The Pro-Life

March for Life will follow at 10am. Please be part of this important spiritual and social work of mercy on Saturday, January 29.

One of the truths about the Catholic community is that we really do care for one another. We'd like to know one another better. We'd like others to know us better too. We are important. We have something to share. Come to the Town Hall Meeting. It will change your life!

FAITHFUL DEPARTED

Question:

How can we pray for the dead throughout the year?

Answer:

We commemorate the faithful departed on November 2nd each year. However, we can and should continue to pray for the dead. Our growth in Christian perfection takes a long time. At the time of our death, many of us might not be saints yet. But God, in His mercy, allows for those who love Him to experience purification after death. Our word for that state is Purgatory. It's the antechamber of heaven, so to speak. We know we're getting in the house, but we're not quite ready to go all the way in. There's rain to shake off our coats and dirt that's clogging our shoes.

Here on earth, we can pray for the souls in Purgatory. One way is to request that your parish offer a Mass for the intention of a specific loved one. ST. SEBASTIAN | JANUARY 20

Not much is known about the life of St. Sebastian (256 – 287), except that he was a Roman martyr whose name has been mentioned throughout history since early 350.

We see St. Sebastian many times in art, especially from iconic paintings from Guido Reni, Andrea Mantegna and Hendrick ter Brugghen. Historical scholars now agree that a spiritual story has the beloved saint entering the Roman army because only there could he assist Christian martyrs without arousing suspicion on himself. Eventually he was found out, brought before Emperor Diocletian and delivered to Mauritanian archers to be shot to death. Pierced with arrows, he was left for dead, but managed to survive. He recovered from his wounds but still refused to leave.

One day, St. Sebastian took up a position near where the emperor was to pass. He confronted the emperor, condemning him for his cruelty to Christians. This time the sentence of death was carried out, and St. Sebastian was beaten to death with clubs. Today he is the patron saint of athletes.

We will also share the a breakdown of the draft Mission, meaning that we will take each of the words in the draft Mission statement, and we'll add definition and meaning to them. We are excited to share that with you, because you'll see just how powerful this draft Mission statement is! We will then explain the process for discerning the Vision for our future, as well as what we'll need to do to prepare to actually pursue that Vision.

The best part of the Town Hall meeting, though (besides the home-baked goodies and refreshments), will be the opportunity for parishioners to break into small groups and discuss some key questions with each other. We will then "report out" to the bigger group and get a feel for what's on the minds and in the hearts of our parishioners. This Town Hall will kick off the process by which parishioners will be engaged to generate ideas about the future of our beloved St Mary's parish. We really hope you plan to attend.

For now, think about the following questions and let them percolate in your mind as you pray about what God is calling our parish to do.

1. Who is our community? Do we have more than one community? If so, who are they?
2. What role should we play in our community(ies)?
3. What does it look like for us as a parish to worship, serve, and proclaim Jesus Christ?
4. How does our parish invite and support us and others to worship, serve, and proclaim Jesus Christ?
5. How will we show that we are inviting the help of our Blessed Mother?

In 5 years, what will our parishioners be pleased with about our parish, and what will visitors and community members say about our parish?
