# LETTER FROM OUR PASTOR

#### A Jeremiah Reflection

The great prophet Jeremiah is presented to us in this weekend's readings, and the suffering he endured at the hands of Zedekiah, the vassal king of Judah, probably around the year 587 BC. During this time, the Babylonians were besieging the city of Jerusalem, and Jeremiah advised a conciliatory response to the Babylonians as opposed to armed revolt. He was thrown into prison for his efforts, and thus the story we heard in our first reading.

Jeremiah was born around 650BC in a small town about three miles outside of Jerusalem. His prophetic role emerged during the thirteenth year of the reign of Josiah, who ruled Judah from 640 BC to 609 BC. Josiah is credited with introducing major religious reform in Judah, particularly the removal of worship of gods other than Yahweh from official worship in the land.

I would like to reflect on a passage from the 18th chapter of the Book of Jeremiah, an experience that likely occurred during the hopeful period of Josiah's reform, prior to 609BC. The text reads:

This word came to Jeremiah from the LORD: Arise and go down to the potter's house; there you will hear my word. I went down to the potter's house and there he was, working at the wheel. Whenever the

vessel of clay he was making turned out badly in his hand, he tried again, making another vessel of whatever sort he pleased. Then the word of the LORD came to me: Can I not do to you, house of Israel, as this potter has done? Indeed, like clay in the hand of the potter, so are you in my hand, house of Israel (Jer. 18: 1-6).

Overall, this message from the Lord is assuring Jeremiah that the future of Israel is in the Lord's hands. This spiritual experience would haven given Jeremiah courage: the Lord, who is all powerful, is at work. God can remake Israel. What is happening with Josiah's reform is likely a slow and painful process for Jeremiah. And yet, Yahweh is the potter, shaping the clay of Israel into a beautiful creation.

I think this story can be helpful to us at a personal and communal level. On a personal level, we can see ourselves as clay in the hands of the Lord. Sometimes our life becomes misshapen, and the Potter (that is, the Lord) gently remakes it, providing we are docile to His work in us, provided we lean into His hands and allow Him to re -form us. It is a beautiful meditation to think of those hands, gently touching us, strong and firm, ridding us of the imperfections and marks of time and sin, restoring our strength, our form, our beauty as a child of God. The message on a personal level is to

feel those hands, to lean into them, to cooperate with the healing and conversion that Lord is offering us.

On a communal level, we think of our parish, of the "little flock of Christ" that is St. Mary's. We are being re-formed by the hand of the Lord into the house of the Lord in downtown Lincoln. The parish has changed. Downtown Lincoln is changing. But God has not abandoned us. God is very present here and has a purpose and plan for our lives and the lives of those who live in this area and who come to His house on 14th and K Street.

Like Jeremiah, we don't know precisely what He has in mind for us or what this will look like in 3 years, or 5 years, or 25 years. At this point, we see ourselves best as clay in the hand of the Potter, willing to allow Him to form us into the community He desires, that we might undertake the mission He entrusts to us in downtown Lincoln. Like Jeremiah, the question of the Lord is posed to us: Can I not do to you, house of Israel (or house of St. Mary) as this potter has done? Our answer is Yes. Let it be done to us according to your



#### 20th Sunday in Ordinary Time:

An inward transformation occurs in a person who decides to follow Jesus Christ. Things change. They see the world differently, understand their journey more deeply and profoundly, have their sights fixed on eternity and union with God and hold themselves to higher standards and virtues. It requires a conscious choice to be a Christian, and this choice must be renewed at least daily. While the basic premise of Jesus' message may appear heartwarming and straightforward: love of God, neighbor, and self, the implications of doing so are challenging. The true disciple is called to live radically, and often finds themselves at odds with the world or even with those in their own homes.

#### St. Stephen of Hungary, August 16

Born a pagan in the 10th century Saint Stephen was baptized as a boy when his father converted to Christianity. Saint Stephen married Gisela, daughter of Duke Henry II of Bavaria who



would become Saint Henry II. He succeeded his father as leader and began to transform the nation into a Christian kingdom.

Pope Sylvester II proclaimed him the first king of Hungary in 1001, sending him a crown and gold processional cross. The crown, made in the Byzantine style, has become a symbol of Hungarian nationhood. King Stephen's reign was a relatively peaceful and prosperous time. He outlawed paganism, mandated church building, and tithing for support of the parish, and commanded all to marry except clergy and religious. He founded a Benedictine monastery, and Hungary became an important place along the route to the Holy Land for many pilgrims.

Unfortunately, Stephen's son and heir died in a hunting accident, causing much conflict over the succession when the saint died. Eventually the kingdom was won back for Christendom and father and son were canonized in 1083 by Pope St. Gregory VII. Saint Stephen I is now patron saint of Hungary.


